

Scholars student Isabel Guerra earned her living cleaning other people's houses. Now, she's an administrative assistant.

Nine months ago, Upward

Isabel's trajectory was made possible by Upward Scholars, a local nonprofit that provides financial and academic support to low-income adults, mostly immigrants, so they can continue their education in community college, get better jobs, and serve as role models and advocates for their children.

Isabel is a native of



Guatemala, and after arriving in the U.S., Isabel, age 29, enrolled in ESL

classes, first at Sequoia Adult School, where she took basic ESL classes, and then at Canada College where, after completing a rigorous ESL sequence, she ultimately completed freshman-level college English. She then started taking paralegal classes with a goal of obtaining her paralegal certificate. During her three-year tenure at Canada, Upward Scholars paid for Isabel's books, which often cost several hundred dollars a semester, gave her a

laptop, and provided her with a volunteer tutor, Menlo Park resident Rick Trushel.




